**MINUTES of the Regular Meeting

TREASURER'S REPORT: Presented by Rolly Siemonsen. The bank balance is \$4664.89 and the book balance is \$4354.89. Difference due to outstanding cheques to MAAC and fun fly expenses. We now have 80 members plus 2 signed at this meeting.

C.F.I'S REPORT: Presented by Cliff Smith. Wilfred Hill gave Ed George his "wings" test, but he was not present at the meeting to be presented his wings.

CD's REPORT: Presented by Mike Siemonsen. Peter Wagner will arrange for the cash float. Rolly Siemonsen will get two different coloured dual rolls of raffle tickets. Jason Matheson will bring extra garbage bags. It was decided that US money would be exchanged at par. The entry fee for juniors was set at \$15.00. A junior was any person twelve years of age or younger. The following prizes were donated. A "Minus" kit was donated by Mike Siemonsen, Steve Haynes has a cruise package, Russ Woods has a "Super Zoom Kit", and maple syrup was donated by Gary Gorr. Rolly and Kevin Siemonsen have also offered to donate things for the raffle draws. Byron MacLean has finalized the menu at two kabobs per person, baked potatoes, corn on the cob, salad, and bread. Mike finalized by saying, "The Fun-Fly is good to go".

MAINTENANCE & PROJECTS: Byron MacLean purchased two paint scrapers so that volunteers could scrape the west and south sides of the clubhouse prior to re-painting. The scheduled work party was well attended, and the brush in the northwest corner of the field was removed. Gord Clifford leveled the patio stone in the clubhouse sidewalk, and removed the damaged patio stones in the pit area. The porta-potties have been delivered to the site, including one with wash-

up facilities. Rolly reports that the field is in great shape for the fun fly. Two of the old barbecues have been repaired and working well.

OLD BUSINESS: Byron MacLean is going to co-ordinate with Cliff Smith, the canteen supplies and equipment for the Electric Fun Fly. Chris Driver reported that the Whig Standard story about the club and the fun-fly did not happen, but Chris is going to try and contact his contact again.

NEW BUSINESS: Mike Walsh reported that this might be the last year for the Jet Rally. Most of the models this year were actual turbines. Mike suggests checking out the photographs on the web site. The club is running it's first float fly of the year on June 24, 2007 at the Varty Lake site. See the KRCM web site for further details and a map. The issue of garbage being left at the site was raised. The club has a very simple but definite policy in regards to garbage. ***"IF YOU BRING IT TO THE FIELD, TAKE IT HOME WITH YOU"***. It was also brought to the members' attentions that if you crash a plane, pick up ALL of the pieces, including the broken propeller.
